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### Hotel Anahi

Whether you're in Rome to visit monuments, snap up luxury goods, do some professional work or relax with a book, Hotel Anahi is well-located and well-equipped. A five-minute walk brings you to the Piazza del Popolo, one of Rome's grandest public squares and home to multiple centuries-old churches, particularly Santa Maria del Popolo basilica, which houses works by Raphael, Bernini and Caravaggio. Two of Rome's most famous shopping streets, Via di Ripetta and Via del Corso, are equally close. And within the hotel's 19th-century building — whose rooms and common areas feature William Morris wallpapers, herringbone floors and other touches of late 1800s design — you can take advantage of the lobby's antique desks, plush couches and selection of multilingual literary works.
